Farewell, but not Good Bye for President Oupa Pilane

After a great farewell speech delivered by Pilane at the KLCBT's recent AGM, Oupa Pilane pledged to serve the organisation as a member in any capacity as the leadership may see fit, when his term as President ends in August this year.
