The Problem

System failures

- Survivors retell trauma at every step
- Hospital staff shortages causing delays in forensic exams
- Limited sensitivity training at police stations
- Courts are confusing and re-traumatising
- No safe place to go after reporting

The system was not built for survivors.

GRIP fills the gaps inside the system

- One case, one team. No repeated disclosures
- First Responders present at police stations & hospitals
- Immediate emotional + practical support
- Court preparation and accompaniment
- Safe shelter + long-term recovery support

The Circle of Care

One survivor. One journey. One team.



1. Police Station Care Rooms

Support during reporting, rights explained, dignity protected



2. Hospital Care Rooms

Support through forensic exams, HIV prevention, follow-up care



3. Court Support

Preparation, accompaniment, and post-court debriefing



4. Shelters

Safe housing, counselling, skills training, exit planning



5. Prevention & Youth Programmes

PowerGirls & Voices of Tomorrow, breaking the cycle

- 50,000+ survivors supported since 2000
- 96% from under-served communities
- 25+ years of continuous service
- 6 police stations | 6 hospitals | 3 courts | 2 shelters
- Multiple national & international media features

We lost 52% of our funding in 2025

Disbandment of USAID ended the NACOSA grant that made up half of GRIP's annual income.

- Care rooms closed
- Programmes stopped
- 27 staff lost

Despite this, every staff member was paid on time, every creditor was settled. No corners were cut on care.
